Objectives

In this activity students will learn how to modify common phrases or concerns into more work friendly statements.

Standards

Project Time

This project will take about 1 hour to complete.

Ethics Statement

Project Details

Students will learn how words affect perception.

Students will modify several sentences into statements that don't elicit negative responses.

RUBRIC

50 points - Sentences are rewritten into acceptable remarks.

50 points – Minimal grammatical errors.
