  - FBLA stands for Future Business Leaders of America and it is for high school and middle school students
2. What does PBL stand for, and what students is it for?
  - Phi Beta Lambda and it is for College and Technical School students
3. Where is FBLA-PBL headquartered, and how is it organized?
  - FBLA-PBL is headquartered in Reston, Virginia, and organized on local, state, and national levels, with five (5) Regions at the national level. Business teachers, advisers, and advisory councils (including school officials, businesspeople, and community representatives) guide local chapters.
4. When, where, and by whom was the FBLA concept developed?
  - The FBLA concept was developed in 1937 by Dr. Hamden L. Forkner of Columbia University. The first high school chapter was chartered in Johnson City, Tennessee on February 3, 1942.
5. Where and when was the first high school chapter chartered?
  - Forkner of Columbia University. The first high school chapter was chartered in Johnson City, Tennessee on February 3, 1942. In 1958, the first PBL collegiate chapter was chartered in Iowa. The Professional Division, originally the Alumni Division, began in 1979.
6. How many total members are there at all levels, including advisers?
  - FBLA-PBL is one of the largest student organizations in the United States, with 253,365 members, and the largest career student organization in the world. Local FBLA-PBL chapters are often connected to their school's business education department, and most advisers are business education teachers.

  - FBLA-PBL is funded by membership dues, conference fees, corporate contributions, and grants.
