Janus v.AFSCME was a landmark US labor law United States Supreme Court case concerning the power of labor unions to collect fees from non-union members. The state of Illinois' removal of agency fees from disapproval public-sector employees violates the First Amendment Abood v. Detroit Bd. of Ed. which concluded otherwise is overruled. Goldstein & Russell, P.C. whose attorneys contribute to this blog in various capacities is among the counsel on an amicus brief in support of the respondents in this case. 5-4 in an opinion by Justice Alito on June 27, 2018. Justice Sotomayor filed a differ opinion. Justice Kagan filed a differ opinion in which Justices Ginsburg, Breyer, and Sotomayor joined.
